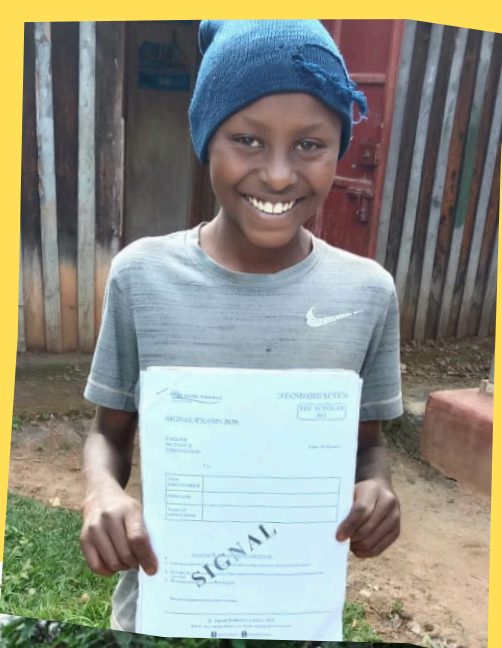


community mobilisation

To strengthen education in these times where access is a challenge, some families have received solar panels for lighting to enable the children to study at night. We were also able to trace Rebecca's family whom she has not seen for the last five years. She has now been reunited with her older sister and paternal grandmother.

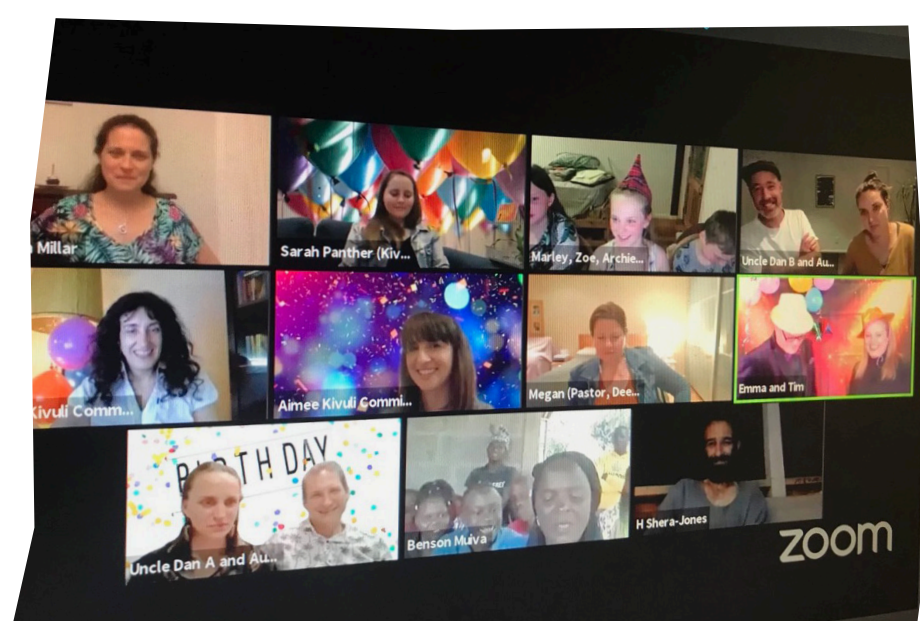


covid-19 update
